

MODERN INTERNATIONAL PROTOCOLS ON THE MANAGEMENT OF DRUG ALLERGY

Summary

Objective: *to develop the strategy to adapt the national allergology to the demands of modern reform in the healthcare industry on the example of drug allergy as a separate section. International experience shows the need for a phased and integrated approach to the construction of the healthcare system both in terms of individual health sectors and nosology with multi-disciplinary positions. All this applies to allergology in general and its individual sections in particular. The reforming of the health sector in Ukraine, with a clear separation of primary care and specialty care has put forward the need to review a number of existing documents which govern the activities of physicians of different specialties. This distinction requires first of all the strengthening and improvement of primary care; however, it should not distract attention from the development of highly specialized care. The experience of developed countries in Europe and the United States suggests the possibility of involving the additional resources to specialized care by shifting the routine clinical work upon general practitioners of family medicine. The basis of the methodological approach was provided by positive experience in cooperation of the European Academy of Allergy and Clinical Immunology (EAACI), the British Society for Allergy and Clinical Immunology (BSACI) and the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology (AAAAI) with the regulatory authorities of the respective countries and commonwealths. By focusing on such a topical issue as the drug allergy, it should be noted that the provision of medical assistance is governed by national settings, guidelines and protocols, as well as multidisciplinary documents which delimit the powers of professionals of different specialties – anesthesiologists, allergists, internists, etc. The cornerstone of this collaboration is the involvement of the professional societies who currently act as initiators or partners to develop such documents into the creation, negotiation and implementation of such regulations.*
